






What is Hate Crime?

Hate crime is any criminal offence which is perceived by the victim or any other person, to be motivated by hostility or prejudice based on a persons race, religion or belief, sexual orientation, disability or transgender status.



What can I do?

Staff and students who witness or are a victim of hate crime can make a confidential and anonymous report and access support by contacting ASC.

A Hate Crime is any criminal offence which is perceived, by the victim or any other person, to be motivated by a hostility or prejudice based on a person's race, religion or belief, sexual orientation, disability or transgender status.



Hate Crime ranges from verbal abuse and harassment to criminal damage and serious assaults. Hate crime affects victims, families and the wider community and targets people for who they are.
